OBJECTIVES & BENEFITS

The Small Business Chamber Alliance allows your chamber to add value to your small business members at no additional cost to you or them. As a State Chamber member, any small business (2-25 employees) that belongs to your organization can take advantage of our Small Business Chamber Alliance to:

- **SUPPORT SMALL BUSINESS** – Open the door to new connections and resources for your members that will keep them informed, engaged and help their business thrive
- **GAIN ACCESS** – Take advantage of the State Chamber of Oklahoma's association health plan, Oklahoma Chamber Blue, an affordable health care solution which includes medical, dental and vision benefits for small business
- **GROW MEMBERSHIP** – Attract new members with a strong retention tool – dual membership for your small business members through participation in the Alliance

QUALIFYING MEMBER DEFINITION

A "qualifying member" of the State Chamber of Oklahoma's "Small Business Chamber Alliance" program is a member in good standing of their local chamber of commerce with 25 employees or less and must not be an existing member or past member of the State Chamber of Oklahoma within the last 6 months.

INITIAL COMMUNICATION

Prior to the local chamber of commerce launching this program to their members, they agree to communicate to their eligible members regarding this program to inform them of the opportunity to "opt-out" of the program prior to launch. Eligible members or any other company may "opt out" of this program at any time by communicating to both the local chamber of commerce and the State Chamber of Oklahoma.

REQUIREMENTS

- The local chamber of commerce must be a member in good standing to participate in the Small Business Chamber Alliance.
- To comply with federal regulations for the Oklahoma Chamber Blue program, the local chamber of commerce must submit a list of all members with 25 employees or less by October 1 each year.
 - As new members, who are eligible for the Small Business Alliance program, join the local chamber of commerce, the local affiliated chamber of commerce must submit a list of the new members by the 5th of each month.
- In addition to sending this information to the State Chamber, there may be additional requests to the local chamber for verification of membership to ensure all members are in good standing and eligible for the Small Business Chamber Alliance program.

Disclosure: The annual membership list and the monthly membership updates will not be used for solicitation purposes by the State Chamber of Oklahoma.
